that He may grant unto us, the forgiveness of our sins.

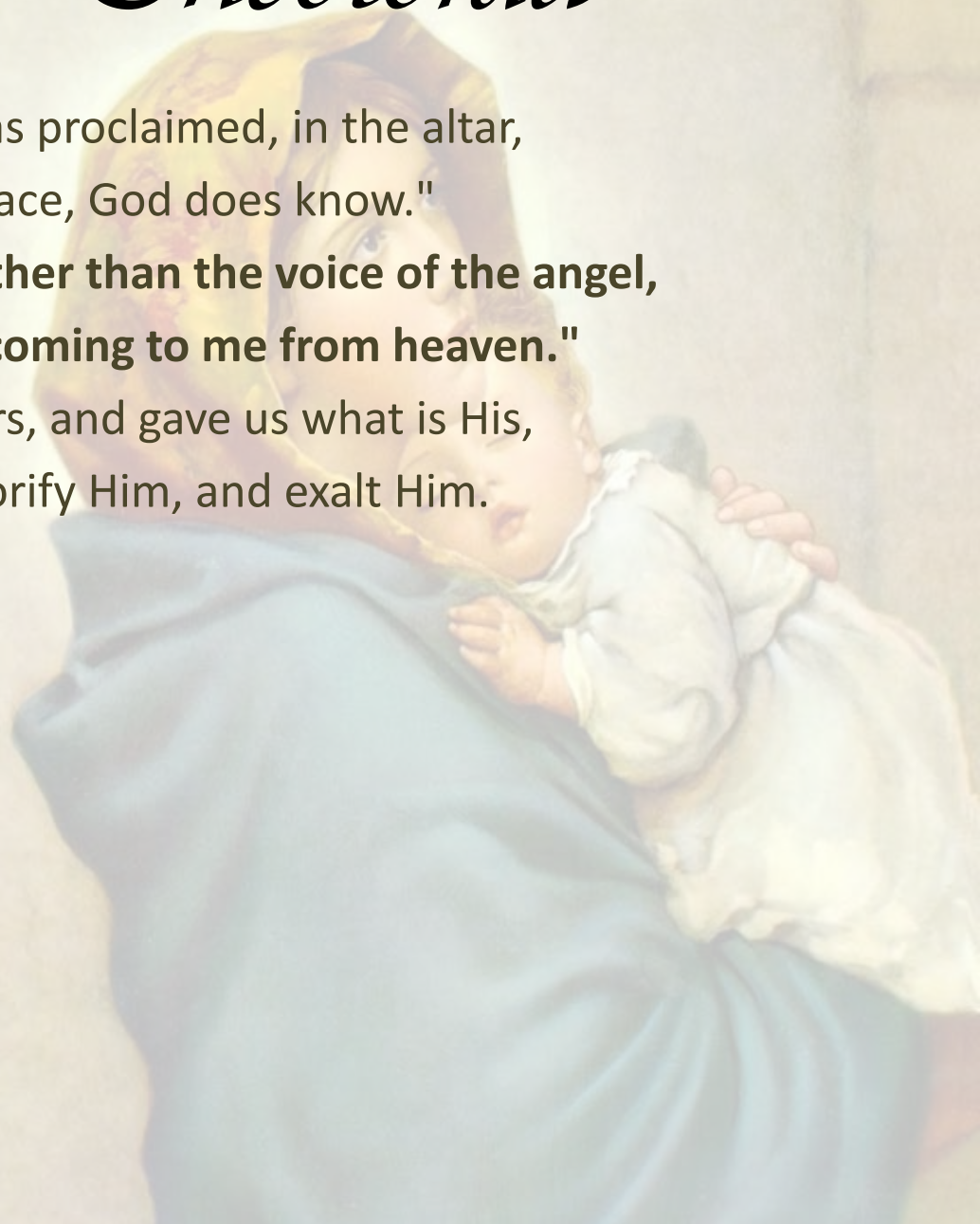
